From 2008 he has been a visiting lecturer at the Faculty of Croatian Studies, University of Zagreb (Department of Communication Studies), teaching several courses on media culture and publishing. From 2008 he has been a lecturer at the school of communication studies organized by <i>Matica hrvatska</i> which gathers the best students of media studies from the Faculty of Politics and Croatian studies, University of Zagreb. He obtained his PhD at the Faculty of Theology, University of Zagreb in 2012 with a thesis on the philosophy of L. Pareyson entitled "Ethical aspects of Luigi Pareyson's philosophy. Truth, freedom, person". He also worked in publishing: he was president of the Supervisory Board of <i>Glas Slavonije</i> in 2009 - 2011. He was editor of the special editions of <i>Glas Slavonije</i> from 2004 to 2009, as well as the assistant editor in |
