The Festival objective is to strengthen international cultural cooperation and exchange of experiences of young people, and to promote the theatre as a place of meeting and dialogue of different professions: actors, musicians, dancers, costume designers, scene designers, architects, nutritionists, managers, economists, lawyers, pedagogues. The Festival takes place in a stimulating environment, which is ideal for the ambient theatre, in an area where natural beauty, cultural heritage, tourism and exquisite gastronomic offer are intertwined.

The magical ambient of Bale itself is inspiring us to dedicate this year's Young Theatre Festival to wine and love. In the name of love we create, in the

The Bale municipality

The stony town of Bale, still offering Istrian tradition and architecture, exists since the time of the Roman Empire, as proven by archaeological research. The Bale fortress defended the trade route between Pula and the interior of Istria. In the Middle Ages, the Roman castrum was built as a small town fortified by walls, first mentioned as Castrum Vallis or Valle in 965. Today, Roman Castrum Vallis is a small town, which historical centre is located 145 meters above the sea level, surrounded by hills. In Bale today, you can enjoy peace and quietness, visit the Gothic-Renaissance castle Soardo-Bembo, the 19th-century tower located in the town centre, the parish church, and take a look at the town hall with a loggia from the 14th century...

Camping Mon Perin

Camping Mon Perin with its 9-kilometer long pebble and stone beach is located between Pula and Rovinj, in the immediate vicinity of the medieval town of Bale. Surrounded by untouched nature, in the deep shade of oaks and pines, the camp offers accommodation on spacious and equipped plots, on campsites for tents, and in mobile homes that, in addition to comfort, offer a dose of exquisite luxury. In addition to attractive animation programmes and events for children and adults, there are also many sports and recreational facilities, and guests can relax on restaurant terraces or in beach bars located along the beach, they can gather around a beach barbecue or watch a movie at the open-air cinema.

From exaggerations to non-acting

Is there a stage presence outside of acting? How can we be present on stage without acting? Let's play with different levels of acting. From exaggeration to non-acting.

ANDRÁS HATHÁZI, professor, actor, director, writer, playwriter. His research areas include improvisation and acting theory. He is currently a professor (Prof. Univ. Dr. Habil.) at the Faculty of Theatre and Film of Babeş-Bolyai University (Department of Hungarian Theatre) from Cluj-Napoca, Romania. In the period from 2011 to 2017 he was in charge of a workshop at the Dioniz International Festival of Theatre Academies organised by the Academy of Arts and Culture in Osijek. He played over 100 film, theatre and television roles, and directed several plays and films. He wrote three books and translated one. He won over 50 (national and international) awards for his artistic work.

Suzuki training (training of voice and body)

Suzuki training, also known as "foot grammar", was developed by the Japanese director Tadashi Suzuki as a group dynamics exercise, a sort of performance for actors and dancers. It gains on international popularity and takes an increasingly important place in studies of performing arts. By focusing on clarity, simplicity and reduction effect, students achieve more effective handling of voice and body. The training is full of energy by which it supports the presence and pervasion, as well as sensual vital strength and attention (ki'ai).

LION KOCH was born in 1995. He started his formal education at the Academy in Freiburg, Germany, where he completed his studies and became a member of the ensemble Experimentalbuhne im E-werk. During three years in that ensemble, he acted in over 11 professional roles in plays that were performed all over Europe. He taught the Suzuki method both in Germany and worldwide.

Impro workshop

The Impro workshop will use the techniques, communication principles and activities of improvisational theatre that develop group energy and quality communication among "players". Spontaneity, focus, upgrade, development of storytelling techniques and presentation techniques, as well as laughter are just some of the characteristics of Impro theatre as a specific form of theatre improvisation. Through spontaneous expression within defined structural framework, the workshop participants will go through the stages of an exciting and unexpected journey. From short-movie humorous improvisation to feature-movie odyssevs. stories will be told, the existing ones will be adapted and the multimodality will be cherished.

ŽELJKA FLEGAR was born in Osijek in 1978. She studied English language and literature and German language and literature and graduated from the Faculty of Pedagogy of the University of

and dramatic arts in English language. She deals with improvisational theatre for almost 20 years by delivering courses on improvisation to people of different ages and profiles in schools and theatres in Croatia and Austria, within the course Drama Workshop in English (Faculty of Education, 2005-), within artistic-scientific projects for science popularisation, the course Improvisational Theatre at the Academy of Arts in Osijek (2011), workshops at the Summer School of Entrepreneurship (3EP) at the Faculty of Economics in Osijek (2012), the Dionysius Festival (2016, 2017) and the EKTe Festival: Art through Education, as well as within the excellent cooperation with the Drama Studio of ZKM since 2015. Since 2017, she teaches the course Improvisational Theatre at the Postgraduate Specialist Study of Creative Therapies at the Academy of Arts and Culture in Osijek. She is the author of the book Theatre Improvisation, Language and Communication (2016). She won the prestigious Fulbright scholarship in the

Wine? Why not?

People have been enjoying wine for thousands of years. Today, wine is one of the most consumed alcoholic beverages that attracts attention because of its potentially positive effects on health. From the "French paradox" to Mediterranean diet, when it comes to wine and diet, there are always some doubts and questions to be answered. Louis Pasteur once said: "A bottle of wine contains more philosophy than all the books in the world", and we have to agree with that. Through this workshop, you will find out whether white or red wine is better, whether wine has all effects that are attributed to it, what is meant under moderate consumption of wine, and how to deal with the consequences of excessive consumption.

DANIELA ČAČIĆ KENJERIĆ obtained the title of food technology engineer in 2000 from the University of Osijek and received her doctoral degree

in biotechnical sciences in 2004 from the University of Zagreb. Referring to her teaching engagement, she teaches courses in the area of Nutrition science, Life-long nutrition, Nutritional assessment and epidemiology, Nutrition of athletes and reduction diets at her home institution and at the University of Mostar and the University of Tuzla (BIH) as a visiting professor. Her scientific activity refers mainly to the assessment of nutrition of various population groups of the Republic of Croatia, with a focus on the intake of dietary fibre, calcium, iron and phenolic components. She participated in more than 50 international and national scientific meetings and published more than 50 scientific papers. She also participated or still participates in several international and national scientific and professional projects.

LIDIJA ŠOHER, MSN, was born in Kutina on 12 March 1989. In September 2014, she enrolled the graduate study of Food Science and Nutri-

tion at the Faculty of Food Technology Osijek, and completed it with excellent results in December 2016. FINE ARTS WORKSHOP FOR CHILDREN

Participants: three groups of children

The workshop consists of three sections including three groups of children.

The first group includes 4- to 6-year old children, the second 7- to 9-year old children, and the third group 10- to 12-year old children.

Number of children: 10 to 12 children per group

Workshop duration: 60-90 min

Material: Papers for drawing (smooth) and painting (thick, rough), pencils 2b or 3b, coloured pencils, felt-tip pens, collage paper, glue, scissors, tempera paint, brushes, cups and cloths or paper towels.

ASSIST. PROF. ART. BREZA ŽIŽOVIĆ was born in Pula in 1973. She completed elementary and secondary education in Pula and enrolled the Primary Teacher Education study at the Faculty of Pedagogy in Pula. After completing the study, she obtained a degree of Primary School Teacher. After graduating from the Faculty of Pedagogy, she continued 2-year programme in Painting and 1-year programme in Technique of Old Graphics at Scuola Internazionale di Grafica in Venice. In 1994, she enrolled the 4-year

programme at the College of Visual Arts in Lubljana from which she obtained a degree of a painter. Until 2003, she lived in Ljubljana and worked in the National Gallery and in Šentjakobsko Gledališče. In 2003, she returned to Pula and worked in the Istrian National Theatre as a scene designer and in elementary schools in Vodnjan, Fažana, Vidikovac and Savičenta as a substitute art teacher. In 2008, she started working at the Faculty of Education of Juraj Dobrila University of Pula, as a lecturer of the following courses: Art Methodology, Extracurricular Art Activities, Dramatic and Stage Creation, Art Culture, Shape and Colour, and Puppetry and Stage Culture. In 2011, she enrolled the 5th year of the study programme in Art Pedagogy at the Academy of Applied Arts in Rijeka, and obtained an academic degree of Master of Art Pedagogy. Up to present, she held 11 solo exhibitions, about 30 group exhibitions and created more than 40 scenographies (for Šentjakobsko Gledališče Ljubljana, the Ulysses Theatre, the Istrian National Theatre, the Naranča Theatre, Monte Librić and the Ivan pl. Zajc Croatian National Theatre, the Puppet Theatre Zadar, the Fort Forno Theatre, the Gandusio Theatre).

WORKSHOP FOR THE THIRD AGE PEOPLE

My time - my values

Spending free time in a quality manner is important for a well-being of each person at any age. In the third age, especially with retirement, changes in life routine occur, which usually involve more free time.

As such changes occur after a long period of life that was filled with many obligations, both job-related and private, some people may find it difficult to adapt to new circumstances and make sense of their time. Although each person has their own interests, obligations often prevent them from practicing them, which can lead to a loss of interests.

Therefore, it is useful to remember old interests or to become aware of some new interests that a person wants to pursue, but did not have time for them before. While doing so, interests should be approached as potentials or as opportunities, regardless of whether a person has ever dealt with them before or not.

Also, thinking about personal values helps in discovering of potential interests. What is important and valuable to somebody, which activ-

"Reading and traveling hide within themselves what we love - the challenge of discovering something new", says the author in the afterword of "Love Cartography", and reveals to the reader that in an intimate essayist playfulness, her intention was to find a cultural map of love on which she shall wander, stroll, lose herself and recognise herself in it. Matej Opolcer, a young playwright read the author's cultural map as a story of love, full of desires, passion, expectations, misunderstandings, physical and spiritual vigour, but also pain.

ter, along the river from its source to its mouth, as a series of exciting dialogues and inner monologues about the human soul necessity to love and to be loved. In dramatic situations of possible beginnings and endings of a completely unusual artistic love relationship, he marked the process of creating and imagining his own "I" that rises, flows and overflows into a soulmate. The stage magic of creation, imagined journeys, sincere love and suffering occurs with the inevitable refreshment of wine. In this post-dramatic stage play, he and she try to explain to each other and to themselves the imprinted looks, touches, sips of wine and kisses - those moments of existence in which they flow and overflow into each other like a river, last and live in each other and one because of the other. Director Robert Raponja opened up a space of play for actors in which he erases the boundaries between the fiction and the reality, the visible and the invisible, the possible and the strange, all with

the intention of involving the audience in a co-play

of recognition, seduction and bonding with those who, in a creative vigour, seek the meaning and reason for their existence and actions. The actors create a story together with the audience, the metaphors become meta-phors (meta-fore) of this play in which the author's intentions, dramaturgical inventions and the director's creation of macro and micro actions are revealed.

Gidion's Knot

The play starts in a school when the mother of a recently deceased pupil comes for a meeting with her son's teacher. As it was supposed to be a meet-

ing of teachers and parents with representatives of the pupils and the school, the teacher is surprised that the mother came to see her in the first place. The conversation that follows deals with the relationship between grieving mother Corrvin (Korina) and emotionally overwhelmed teacher Heather (Ružica). Korina's son, a primary school pupil, committed suicide on the day when he was expelled from school. Gidion may have been abused or may have been an abuser who abused others. During the conversation, the women try to find out what was the cause of Gidion's tragic act. The play deals with many key issues related to the education system, the responsibility of teachers, freedom of expression, the roles of parents and teachers in an increasingly chaotic world. Current problems of the educational system, rights and duties of teachers, parents and pupils are among the most important issues in contemporary society. We are strongly convinced that the theatre should also deal with the problems of our society.

We will start the magic of verses about love with Vesna Parun, the greatest poet of the 20th century. Essayist, playwright, satirist, polemicist, translator and painter worked with many genres, forms and styles, yet she remained FAITH- FUL to the truth of her heart. Love is her permanent life and poetic inspiration - an oil lamp that never dried out. We are led through the verses of love magic also by **LUKO PALJETAK**, a poet, novelist, painter, translator, children's writer, editor - a contemporary blend of homo ludens and homo universalis. Through the magic of verse of the canonical author **IRENA VRKLJAN**, a poet, prose writer, translator and one of our best authors, we are led into the intimacy of survival of a lonely woman after the death of her beloved German writer Benn Mayer-Wehlack.

Wine

The verses of Tomislav Marijan Bilosnić, a poet, prose writer, journalist, painter, an Adriatic homo universalis, will lead us to the odes to wine, grape vines and lively toasts.

In his verses, **ENES KIŠEVIĆ**, a drama artist and poet, will reveal the joy of enjoying wine, and the songs of **ARSEN DEDIĆ** and **JAKŠA FIAMENGO**, poets of the Croatian Mediterranean circle, will reveal to us all the joy of hanging out with wine, quitars and friends.

Exhibition Places That Do Not Exist


The exhibition "Places that do not exist" presents a series of photos, cyanotype and Van Dyke prints, as well as film, which uses a motif of space as a common thread. Completely intuitive, through experimenting and testing of possibilities of media, cyanotype and Van Dyke were created first. By selecting segments of those images that remind me of a new place. photos were created through enlargement. And at the end; film as a medium that unites images and photos into one whole. In the film, I try to distinguish the notion of watching deprived of what is learned and seen in relation to the inner world of sitting, thus making tangible that which cannot be verbalised. This film is an exploration of space: the external one that is connected with the internal one which we carry inside of us - more precisely, how we feel the space in which we live. By this film, I present my abstract images, which I brought to life by using film as a medium, to turn them into places that are stolen, lived, passed by, changed. By treating the film as a canvas, without any additional interventions, the film establishes intermediality with painting, emphasising the emotions which are carried by each place. The whole exhibition is connected through these three media of painting, photography and film, by transforming one place into a completely new and different one, opening up a new circle of possibilities which are provided but not completed by each medium, thus creating an abstract form in which this flow always remains open to new unpredictabilities.
